- All our events that include invited speakers include at least one female speaker.
- We have run an event free of charge to students during 2017 and this event included two mid-career female invited presenters.
- We ran an outreach activity in 2017 which was staffed by volunteers who were a diverse
 mixture of gender and ethnicity as the invitation to volunteer at the event was open to
 anyone.
